## **SOAR!** Awards Over \$1 Million in Grants

 $\mathcal{A}$ t the May meeting of the SOAR! board of directors, members approved grants of more than \$1 million to 64 religious congregations of women and men in 20 states. These grants will provide fundamental assistance allowing thousands of women and men religious to live out the last years of their lives in dignity, safety, and with modest care.

Sisters worked without retirement benefits, nor a just wage, for most of their lives. It is only within the last 20 years that Sisters have been paid wages based on experience and education. SOAR! supports congregations who struggle financially to meet the basic needs of aging Sisters. SOAR! grants will help religious congregations to meet the needs of their elderly members by providing very basic help—the purchase of therapeutic and medical equipment, the renovation of space for handicapped accessibility and structural safety, and the installation of fire alarm and wander guard systems. Your generosity allows SOAR! to provide very needed funding. The next 8 to 10 years are critical as this is when the number of elderly Sisters will reach a peak.

More than 65% of all religious women and men are over the age of 70 and 33% are older than 80. According to recent studies, the total under-funded retirement liability for religious congregations is almost \$13 billion. Many religious congregations have limited capacity to build up resources to care for their elderly and infirm members. The current average annual Social Security Benefit for religious is \$4,779 compared to more than \$14,000 for lay recipients.

Your generosity is what makes these grants possible and the men and women religious are deeply grateful to all SOAR! contributors and pray daily for your intentions.

Members of SOAR!'s board of directors delivered grant checks to many congregations around the country.


