a horse stable, being a civil engineering designer, and now, a geriatric social worker. Everything I do is a result of the encouragement I received from these exceptional women and a reflection of the values which they passed on to me.

And this is from a donor named Teresa from Maryland:

I had a stuttering problem as a young child. Getting up in front of a classroom seemed to make it worse. Sister Josephine, my first grade teacher, noticed that I loved singing and that I didn't stutter when I sang. One day, Sister asked me to stay in at morning recess. She explained that



talking is like singing. She worked with me a couple days a week over the ensuing months. The stutter ceased before the end of the school year.

Because of her patience and belief in me, I've been able to use my voice over the years in my own classrooms, at presentations, and as a lector in my parish. She also taught me the importance of meeting your students where they are and helping them blossom.
