Sister Pat, whose dog often accompanied her when visiting her mother in assisted living, noticed the difference that animal-human interactions made in the lives of the residents, and soon "Pets with Heart" began.

Along with Buster and Zoey, Sisters Pat and Sharon are a welcome sight for the Sisters in supportive living, as well as for those in the neighboring community. The initiative is integrated with the environmental, ecological, and social justice outreach embraced by the congregation. The dogs have visited people in hospitals, nursing homes, schools, and community centers.



Sister Sharon noted that while visiting with the Sisters, especially those with memory issues, the dog may be at the center, but the focus is on the wonderful conversations that are shared. "When I walk into a room with Buster, so many Sisters say, 'You made my day!'"


